UNDERGRADUATE ACCOMMODATION AT CANTERBURY

Accommodation is offered to all new, eligible, fulltime students for their first year of study. Set within 300 acres of parkland, the Canterbury campus offers:

- over 5,000 bedrooms for single occupancy
- en-suite facilities in over 50%
 of bedrooms
- over 85% of bedrooms with self-catering facilities
- high-speed wired and Wi-Fi internet connection throughout the accommodation
- all utility costs and personal contents room insurance included in the accommodation fees.

Kent has three accommodation options for undergraduate students.

Self-catered accommodation

On central campus, Turing and Keynes offer en-suite bedrooms in flats and rooms in houses with shared bathroom facilities. Tyler Court offers flats with en-suite bedrooms and houses with shared bathroom facilities are available at Darwin.

Our student village, Park Wood, also offers en-suite bedrooms in flats and more than 260 five or six-bedroom houses with shared bathroom facilities. Park Wood is located in a beautiful woodland setting and is just a few minutes' walk from central campus. Self-catered flats and houses all have shared kitchens. All self-catered accommodation is offered for a fixed period from September to June, which includes the winter and spring vacations.

Part-catered accommodation – bed and bistro

This unique accommodation package is available to residents of the main building at Keynes College and Becket Court. The package includes an en-suite bedroom, weekday breakfasts and dinners in our flagship bistro, Dolche Vita, located in Keynes College and weekend meals in the dining hall at Rutherford College.

This accommodation is offered for a fixed period from September to June, excluding the winter and spring vacations.

Part-catered accommodation – bed and breakfast

This type of accommodation is offered in Rutherford and Eliot Colleges only. Accommodation costs include breakfast or an allowance towards an evening meal. Other meals may be bought from a wide variety of catering outlets on campus. Rooms are arranged in corridors with shared bathroom facilities and a small kitchenette (suitable for preparing hot drinks and snacks only).

UNDERGRADUATE ACCOMMODATION AT CANTERBURY (CONT)

Kent is one of only a few universities in the UK to offer accommodation in a college environment. The colleges at Kent have their own distinctive character and offer a welcoming and diverse community where it's easy to make new friends with students from around the world.

Our newest college, Turing, offers self-catered accommodation in flats with en-suite bedrooms or houses with shared bathroom facilities.

Darwin College offers self-catered accommodation. Rooms have shared bathroom facilities and access to large, shared kitchens.

Eliot and Rutherford Colleges offer bed and breakfast accommodation. Rooms are arranged in corridors, with shared toilet and shower/bath facilities. Corridors include a small kitchenette with a fridge, kettle and



microwave, for the preparation of hot drinks and light snacks only. Breakfast is available each day. On days where breakfast is not eaten, the breakfast allowance may be used towards an evening meal instead. Keynes College and Becket Court offer accommodation on a bed and bistro basis. All rooms have en-suite facilities and you have access to a small kitchenette. Weekday breakfasts and evening meals are served in Keynes College's bistro, Dolche Vita, and at weekends meals are served in Rutherford dining hall.

The table, left, shows the occupancy periods for college accommodation from September to June.

Accommodation types and guide prices

Fees shown are for the 2014/15 academic year. Accommodation fees for 2015/16 will be available on our website from May 2015. Fees include high-speed wired and Wi-Fi internet connection, personal contents room insurance and gas, electricity and water charges. To qualify for an offer of accommodation (subject to eligibility), you should apply online at www.kent.ac.uk/ accommodation as soon as you accept your academic offer or by 31 July 2015 at the latest.

POSTGRADUATE ACCOMMODATION AT CANTERBURY

Accommodation is offered to new, eligible, full-time students in their first year of study.

Woolf College provides on-campus accommodation for postgraduate students in a diverse community with more than 60 nationalities represented. It has a lecture theatre and seminar rooms so you live and study in a thriving community.

Each of the 544 single occupancy bedrooms has its own shower, washbasin and toilet and every room is networked to the University's main computer system. The accommodation comprises flats with six or eight students sharing a large, fully equipped kitchen. There are also some self-contained studio rooms with their own cooking facilities. Woolf College also has its own launderette.

Only full-time postgraduate students on a 12-month programme of study starting in September are eligible for accommodation at Woolf College.

You should apply online by 31 July 2015 to qualify for an offer of accommodation, subject to eligibility. After this date you will be offered accommodation subject to availability. Postgraduates on short-term exchange or diploma programmes, whose academic registration is for less than 12 months or whose programme begins other than in September, should contact the Accommodation Office T: +44 (0)1227 766660 or email accomm@kent.ac.uk



The University has only a few rooms suitable for couples but we regret that there is no accommodation suitable for students with children. Students who need this type of accommodation, or more choice, should consider renting from private sector landlords.

Off-campus accommodation

If you prefer to live in private rented accommodation, you should only lease property that meets the management and safety standards of a private rented sector housing accreditation scheme. The University's off-campus accommodation web page is the best place to start: www.kent.ac.uk/ accommodation

CANTERBURY CAMPUS FACILITIES AND INFORMATION

Insurance

Fees for University accommodation include insurance for loss of personal possessions up to £5,000 in respect of claims arising from fire, flood or theft, including walk-in theft. You can arrange additional cover online via the insurer's website for accidental damage or all risks on high-value items such as mobile phones and laptops.

Car parking

Parking on campus is restricted and our green transport strategy encourages students not to bring cars on to the campus. If you live on campus you may not bring your car to the University, the only exception is for students with severe disabilities. Students who live off campus, outside designated postcode areas of Canterbury city centre, can apply for a permit. Eligible students can apply for a parking permit from the Estates Department after arriving at Kent. See www.kent.ac.uk/estates/ transport/index.html for further information about parking and our excellent local transport facilities.

Other facilities on campus Computer connection

All bedrooms on the Canterbury campus are connected to the University computer network system, which includes a highspeed 24-hour wired and Wi-Fi connection to the internet and access to email, newsgroups and library CD-Roms. Skype is also available. For more details see www.kent.ac.uk/itservices/sbs

Places to eat and drink

There is a wide variety of food outlets on campus that cater for most tastes, including national cuisines and vegetarian options. You can also buy food at the campus minimarket and Park Wood shop or at snack and drinks machines across campus. If you are in self-catering accommodation, you can buy provisions to meet all your dietary needs from one of the main supermarkets in Canterbury.

Real Meal Deal scheme

When you receive your offer of accommodation from the University, you are also able to visit our online store at www.kent.ac.uk/ accommodation and sign up to the Real Meal Deal scheme, which could save you up to 40% on your annual weekday meal costs.

KentOne card

When you first arrive at Kent, you are given a student ID/cashless card. As well as being your photo ID, this card can also be used as a debit card to buy food and drink in Kent Hospitality outlets, the Gulbenkian café bar and Kent Union shops on the Canterbury campus.

Laundry

There are self-service launderettes available in all residential areas across campus, with coin and card-operated washers and driers.

Televisions

Bedrooms do not contain televisions or TV aerials (except the large en-suite rooms at Keynes Flats and the extra large rooms at Turing College). If you want to use a television in your room, or watch TV programmes as they are shown, via your PC, you must have your own television licence. For more information,


Bedding and bed linen

OFF-CAMPUS ACCOMMODATION AT CANTERBURY

Accredited housing

Canterbury has an accreditation scheme for student housing, which is designed to recognise landlords who are concerned for the health, safety and welfare of their student tenants. These landlords have agreed to follow a Code of Conduct to ensure fair, efficient management of their properties, to confirm that they are of a high standard and that they meet all legal obligations. All students are advised to rent only from landlords who are members of this scheme. For more details see www.homestamp.co.uk

New students

If you decide to live off campus in your first year of study, it would be best to arrange a short stay in a guest house or hotel prior to arrival in Canterbury. This will enable you to personally look at the various types of off-campus accommodation available and make the choice that most closely matches your budget and other requirements. It is not advisable to agree to rent or make payment for any private accommodation unseen.

Second to final-year students

Second to final-year students are expected to join with friends to rent houses or flats off campus in Canterbury or the surrounding area.

Canterbury is a welcoming and student-friendly city, just a 25-minute walk or 10-minute bus-ride from the campus. Much of its medieval history is evident in its ancient streets and buildings. The city centre has a cosmopolitan atmosphere, as befits Britain's closest city to continental Europe.

The 2014/15 rental levels for a single room in a shared self-catered house off-campus range from £85 to £100 a week, excluding utility bills. Most private landlords require students to commit to housing agreements that cover 52 weeks.





The Accommodation Office website contains a downloadable housing guide and links to maps, plus useful information about renting properties in the local area.

Kent and Canterbury

The county of Kent is known as the 'Garden of England' and offers you an opportunity to live and study in one of the most picturesque areas of the country. The nearest seaside town to Canterbury is Whitstable, offering water sports including windsurfing, yachting and waterskiing. The coastal towns of Herne Bay, Ramsgate, Margate, Deal and Broadstairs are also close by.

Transport links

London is just under an hour away by high-speed train and there is a frequent coach service to London and beyond. You can be in Paris or Brussels in around two hours by train from the Channel Tunnel at Folkestone or the Eurostar terminal at Ashford and cross-channel ferries sail daily from Dover to Calais and Dunkirk.

UNDERGRADUATE AND POSTGRADUATE ACCOMMODATION AT MEDWAY

All eligible undergraduate and postgraduate students studying at our Medway campus can live in modern, self-catered, en-suite accommodation at Liberty Quays.

This is a partnership development between the University and Liberty Living and your accommodation offer will be sent to you by Liberty Living, not the University. You will be entering into a contract directly with Liberty Living and will therefore be bound by their payment terms and conditions. For details please see www.libertyliving.co.uk

Liberty Quays

Liberty Quays is part of a dynamic waterside village, Victory Pier, on the banks of the River Medway next to Gillingham Marina, which features a new bistro called Cargo. It is just a ten-minute walk from the Medway campus, with its own Tesco Express, Subway and Domino's Pizza outlets.

All bedrooms have their own shower, washbasin and toilet. Typically, the flats house six or eight students, who share a fully equipped kitchen. The accommodation has its own social facilities and launderette, and each room has access to the University computer network and the internet.

Accommodation is offered to full-time, new undergraduate and postgraduate students. To qualify for an offer of accommodation (subject



to eligibility), you should apply online by 31 July 2015 via https://kenthospitality.kent.ac.uk/ MyAccommodation

Accommodation fees

Fees for 2014/15 are £134 a week for 39 weeks. Accommodation fees are payable directly to Liberty Living and not the University.

Car parking

Parking at Liberty Quays is restricted to Disabled Parking Scheme Blue Badge holders only, for people with a permanent disability that affects their mobility. Please contact Liberty Living regarding parking or see www.libertyliving.co.uk

Parking on the Medway campus is limited and restricted to permit holders only. For further information, see www.kent.ac.uk/estates

EUROPEAN CENTRES

University of Kent, Athens

Accommodation

Kent does not offer University accommodation in Athens but a list of suitable accommodation in Eleusina or central Athens is provided to all students studying on the Heritage Management MA. We can advise on arranging your own rented accommodation and liaise with landlords on your behalf. Please contact the local administrator for more details (heritage@aueb.gr).

Location

The centre is ideally located in the Athenian suburb of Eleusina, the birthplace of Aeschylus and one of the most important archaeological religious sites in the world as a location of the Eleusinian Mysteries. The centre of Athens is only 30km away, and as such you have close access to many other major historical sites including the Parthenon, Ancient Corinth, Nemea and Thebes.

Transport links

Athens is served by Eleftherios Venizelos International Airport 35km away. The city has excellent transport links, including buses, rail, metro and tram services.

Brussels

Accommodation

Kent does not offer accommodation in Brussels, but there are many affordable private rental options available and students usually find a place to live shortly after arrival. Studio apartments, with all charges (utility) included, cost around \in 550-700 a month and a one-bedroom apartment is around \in 650-850



a month. Most students choose to share an apartment and this will cost around €650-800, including utilities.

Brussels School of International Studies, the University of Kent's Brussels centre, is located in the student district between our partner universities, Vrije Universiteit Brussel (VUB) and the Université Libre de Bruxelles (ULB). Much of the housing is a short walk from the University and is designed for students in layout and price.

Notices of available apartments, many of which are being vacated by outgoing Brussels School of International Studies students, are also sent to incoming students via LISTSERV, an automatic electronic mailing list.

Modern city campus

The centre has its own purposedesigned facilities, a 15-minute drive from the centre of Brussels and close to a metro station, a train station and regular bus and tram services. Kent students have full access to all the facilities on the VUB and ULB campuses, including libraries, public computers, bars, cafés and sports facilities.

Local attractions

Brussels is a diverse city, with architecture ranging from medieval rampart walls to the impressive modern architecture built to house several institutions of the European Union. Popular attractions in the city include the Grand Place square with its Gothic and baroque architecture, the 15th-century Hôtel de Ville, and



the Cathedral of St Michael and St Gudula. Brussels has over 80 museums and many beautiful parks and open spaces, including the Parc du Cinquantenaire.

Transport links

While Brussels is a relatively small city for a European capital and is easy to get around on foot, the public transport system is very good and makes it easy to travel quickly around the city. Buses, trams and metros run on a regular schedule and are generally very reliable.

Etterbeek railway station is 50 metres from our Brussels centre and provides regular connections with Schuman, Brussels Nord and Brussels Midi stations. Tram lines 23, 24 and 90 also stop at Etterbeek and the University is a short walk, across the VUB Etterbeek campus, from the Pétillon metro station.

Brussels has excellent transport links with other European cities.

For instance, Paris is only two hours away by train. Ashford (near our Canterbury campus), Ebbsfleet (near our Medway campus) and London can be reached by the Eurostar service in under two hours. Brussels also has a major international airport.

University of Kent, Paris Accommodation

Some of the degree courses at the University of Kent can be taken in Canterbury and Paris. Students who are studying on the University of Kent at Paris programmes may choose to live in on-campus accommodation while studying at the Canterbury campus. To apply for University accommodation, please contact the Accommodation Office.

We offer advice to help students find suitable accommodation in Paris. One option is to stay with a host family. There are also several organisations to help you find short-term accommodation, as well as private agencies. Another source of information is the Francofil mailing list, used by short-term students seeking/offering accommodation in Paris. Our International Development office also has up-to-date information, recommendations from returning

students, contacts in Parisian universities and many years of experience in advising students seeking accommodation in Paris.

Location

Our Paris centre is situated at Columbia Global Center (known as Reid Hall), in the historic heart of Montparnasse, a few minutes' walk from the Jardin du Luxembourg. Reid Hall occupies traditional buildings grouped around two quiet and leafy inner courtyards. It was founded as a porcelain factory in the 18th century and has served as a centre for teaching and research since 1834. Kent postgraduates use facilities at Reid Hall alongside postgraduate students from Columbia University, Barnard College and Dartmouth College.

Transport links

Paris is served by three main airports: Charles de Gaulle, Orly and Beauvais-Tillé, offering international and domestic connections.

Eurostar services to Lille, London, Ebbsfleet, near Medway, and Ashford, near Canterbury, depart from the Gare du Nord station in the centre of Paris and high-speed Thalys trains connect you to Brussels and other northern European cities.

The city's metro system and an excellent city bus network mean you will be able to discover Paris easily and cheaply. Suburban train services, Réseau Express Régional (RER), connect you directly to the



airports and other main train stations. Reid Hall is a five-minute walk from the metro stations Vavin and Raspail and close to the RER station Port-Royal, where you can take a direct train to the Gare du Nord.

Rome

Accommodation

Kent does not offer University accommodation to students on our MA programmes in Rome, at the American University of Rome (AUR). However the AUR can help students to find suitable accommodation in furnished two- and three-bedroom apartments near to the campus with two people sharing a room. Or you may find your own accommodation. University of Kent staff are present for part of the spring term in Rome to ensure continuity of academic guidance and pastoral support.

Location

The American University of Rome's campus is in the picturesque Monteverde district, just a short bus ride to the historic centre of Rome.

Transport links

Rome has excellent transport links including buses, trams and trains.

You should apply for accommodation as soon as you receive formal confirmation via UCAS of a conditional or unconditional offer from the University, even if Kent is your Insurance choice (for conditions of eligibility, see p24).

UCAS Adjustment or Clearing applicants

Complete an application via our Clearing website at www.kent.ac.uk/clearing or call our Clearing hotline 0845 2000 166 or +44 (0)1227 827272 in late August.

Other full-time, short-term and exchange students (non-UCAS)

Complete the online application for accommodation at www.kent.ac.uk/accommodation

You should apply for accommodation as soon as you receive formal confirmation of an offer from the University (for conditions of eligibility, see p24).

Postgraduate applicants

You should apply for accommodation **as soon as you receive formal confirmation of an offer from the University** (for conditions of eligibility, see p24). You will need to make an advance payment of rent of £205 online at the time of application.

Canterbury campus

Postgraduate students applying for accommodation on the Canterbury campus should complete the online application form at www.kent.ac.uk/ accommodation

Accommodation at Woolf College is offered on a 51-week licence. Any postgraduate students whose academic registration is for a period shorter than 12 months (such as short-term exchange or diploma students) should contact the Accommodation Office for further advice.

Deadline for accommodation applications

Applications for accommodation must be received by 31 July 2015. Late, Adjustment and Clearing applicants will be offered accommodation subject to availability.

Offers of accommodation (subject to eligibility)

The University makes new student allocations once all conditions have been met and unconditional places have been confirmed.

For Canterbury accommodation, the offer of a room will be sent to you by email in late August or early September. You can then view your offer online and accept it within seven days.

Deferred entry

If you are accepted for deferred entry in September 2016, you do not need to complete a 2015 accommodation application. You should complete a 2016 online application, available at www.kent.ac.uk/accommodation from December 2015.

Other information for completing the online application

Accommodation preferences

Most corridors and houses are mixed male and female accommodation. If you would prefer to live in female or male-only accommodation, you should request this option on your online accommodation application form under 'Other Accommodation Requests'.

If you are applying for undergraduate accommodation on the Canterbury campus, you can request up to four preferences on your accommodation application, two of which can be en suite. While we cannot guarantee to meet preferences, priority will be given to students choosing Kent as their Firm choice on a first-come first-served basis according to date of accommodation application. Early application is therefore advisable.

Rooms for students with disabilities

A number of rooms in Park Wood, Rutherford, Keynes and Turing Colleges, Tyler Court and Woolf College (Canterbury) and Liberty Quays (Medway) are available for wheelchair users or students with other disabilities.

Postgraduate students

We offer accommodation to new, full-time postgraduate students starting in September 2015 for the first year of study, provided the following criteria are met:

- you have satisfied all the conditions of your offer by 31 July 2015
- the University receives your online application for accommodation by 31 July 2015
- an advance payment of £205 is received by 31 July 2015.

Short-term and exchange students

We offer accommodation to shortterm and exchange students starting in September 2015, provided the following criteria are met:

 you receive acknowledgement of your provisional registration or offer from this University by 31 July 2015

• the University receives your online application for accommodation by 31 July 2015.
