PCRT students take 60 optional credits in stage 1. PDIP and LLM students take 120 optional credits in stage 1. LLM students also take 60 credits in stage 2

**Please note:** Students undertaking a **second** LLM at Kent Law School are **not** permitted to re-take any of the modules that were included as part of their first LLM except LAWS8000 Dissertation and for the second LLM LAWS8000 Dissertation needs to focus on a different topic to the one completed in the first LLM.

## SUBJECT PATHWAYS
