Note: It is ultimately your responsibility to ensure that you are registered for the correct modules for your course.

You must study 120 Credits in both Stage 2 and in Stage 3 (giving a total of 240 Credits over the two Stages); and if appropriate, 120 Credits over Stage 4 (giving a total of 360 Credits over three Stages of a four year course). To be eligible for an Honours degree, at least 90 Credits must be taken at Level 6 in the final stage – i.e. stage 3 or 4 as appropriate. You must ensure that you choose an even weighting of Credits in each term: 60 Credits in the Autumn / 60 Credits in the Spring.

Qualification as a Solicitor or Barrister in England and Wales

All of the undergraduate law degrees offered by Kent Law School will be recognised as Qualifying Law Degrees ('QLD(s)') for the purposes of qualification as a solicitor or barrister for students who start(ed) their courses before:

- September 2022 (for prospective solicitors) i.e. started no later than 31st December 2021; and
- September 2019 (for prospective barristers).

As of 2019 entry, the Bar Standards Board have ceased their recognition of any undergraduate law degree (at Kent, and elsewhere) as a QLD. <u>HOWEVER</u>, in order to continue to satisfy the academic component of professional training for intending barristers, all students must study the 'Foundations of Legal Knowledge' (modules that all KLS undergraduate law degrees offer); and they must adhere to the requirements specified below.

More detailed information about qualification as a solicitor or barrister, QLDs, and the changes to professional qualification, can be found on the relevant professions website.

Students must take and pass (i.e. attain a mark of at least 40% in) the modules containing the Foundations of Legal Knowledge listed below (hereafter referred to as the 'exemption modules') over the course of their degree:

LAWS3150 Introduction to Contract and Tort (15 Credits - Autumn) - Must be taken with LAWS3160 / LAWS5316

LAWS3160 **OR** LAWS53160 Introduction to Property Law (15 Credits - Spring) - Must be taken with LAWS3150

LAWS3270 Introduction to the English Legal System (4 Credits – Autumn)

LAWS5080 Criminal Law (30 Credits - Autumn & Spring)

OR LAWS6010 Criminal Law (30 Credits - Autumn & Spring)

LAWS5880 Public Law 1 (30 Credits - Autumn & Spring)

LAWS5920 Public Law 2 (15 Credits - Spring)

LAWS5930 European Union Law (15 Credits - Autumn)

LAWS5980 Equity and Trusts (15 Credits - Spring)

LAWS5990 Land Law (15 Credits - Autumn)

LAWS6500 The Law of Contract (15 Credits - Autumn)

LAWS6510 The Law of Tort (15 Credits - Spring)

The Law School will assume that all students want to complete these modules, and therefore **all students** will be automatically registered for them.

These modules serve as the Foundations of Legal Knowledge for the purposes of qualification as a barrister, and are required in order to obtain a QLD. To obtain a Qualifying Law Degree (QLD), in addition to the exemption modules, students must also successfully complete a further 60 credits of Law. The QLD is no longer required for continuation to Solicitors' Qualifying Exams (SQE) the route to becoming a solicitor, however it is highly recommended that the Foundations of Legal Knowledge are studied as this knowledge forms the foundation for the SQE.

Students who successfully obtain a QLD are exempt from the need to undertake a conversion course (i.e. the Common Professional Examination) and can proceed directly to the Legal Practice Course (for solicitors) or the Bar Professional Training Course (for barristers). Progression to the vocational component of training for barristers (currently in the form of the BPTC) will remain, as now, subject to successfully completing the Foundations of Legal knowledge and obtaining an overall degree classification of at least 2:2.

Students who **do not** wish to obtain a Qualifying Law Degree/complete the exemption modules, please contact the Director of Undergraduate Law Courses to discuss this.

Implications of failing the Foundations of Legal Knowledge (exemption) modules

It is vital that students **PASS ALL** the exemption modules listed above; there may be serious consequences for failing to do so.

Where a student fails one or more exemption modules, the University's rules governing compensation¹ and condonement² might nevertheless permit the student to progress to the next Stage of their degree, or even pass their degree as a whole. However, the exemption module(s) will still have been failed. As a result, the student will not have passed the Foundations of Legal Knowledge and, where applicable, will not obtain a QLD.

The Bar Standards Board (BSB) grants the Board of Examiners the discretion to compensate a single failure of an exemption module, but only in exceptional circumstances and if specific criteria are met. More information about the criteria can be requested from the LSSJ QA team: lssjqa@kent.ac.uk, but students should contact the Student Support Office: lssjqa@kent.ac.uk, but students should contact the Student Support Office: lssjsupport@kent.ac.uk for guidance on the process of submitting evidence of extenuating circumstances to the Board of Examiners.

Number of attempts

The professional bodies allow a maximum of three attempts at each exemption module (one initial attempt followed by two further attempts). Attempts treated 'as for the first time' do not count for this purpose.

If a student is compensated or condoned **before being given three attempts** to allow them to progress or graduate, the student can sit the module again alongside their course of study.

Time limits

All students, regardless of whether they are full- or part-time, have **six years** to complete their law degree for the purposes of qualifying as a solicitor or barrister.

Note: Discretion is afforded to the Board of Examiners to extend this time limit, but only in exceptional circumstances. Students are advised to contact the Student Support Office: lssjsupport@kent.ac.uk for further guidance.

Conversion course

Students who have not passed all of the exemption modules, or have otherwise failed to obtain a QLD, may be able to complete their academic training by undertaking a conversion course, the Graduate Diploma in Law (GDL), at another institution. The University of Kent does not offer this course. Students in this situation should consult the Director of Studies.

The Law and Economics Course

Students on this course must take **30 extra-curricular Law Credits** in order to obtain a QLD. The University's regulations allow a student to take 30 extra-curricular Credits in either Stage 2 or Stage 3. These Credits will not count towards the final degree classification (although they will appear on the transcript). Students must discuss this with their Academic Advisor

¹ 'Compensation' is where credit is awarded for a module that has been narrowly failed (i.e. a module mark of 30-39% has been achieved).

² 'Condonement' is where credit is awarded for a failed module because of documented illness, or other mitigating circumstances (irrespective of the mark achieved).

and decide which 30 Credits will be extra-curricular before they are studied. Students are welcome to take the 30 Credits split across the two years, with 15 Credits in each stage. Modules cannot be switched subject to results.

'Elective Modules'

During Stages 2 & 3, students are encouraged to consider taking elective modules from other schools delivering Social Sciences and Humanities subjects. Elective modules offer an opportunity to broaden your educational experience, to demonstrate intellectual curiosity and to study subjects that may contribute to your career development. In many courses up to 60 Credits may be obtained from elective modules (a maximum of 30 Credits in each Stage) while still providing a professionally qualifying degree for those that this applies to. You are encouraged to discuss any interest in or questions about elective modules with the Director of Studies.

Students in Stage 2 must choose **level 5 elective modules** and students in Stage 3 must select **level 6 elective modules**. Language study is exempt from these rules and may be studied at any level provided that pre-requisites are met and that you comply with the Credit Framework rules. However, you should note that **Law students are NOT permitted to take Level 4 language modules in Stage 3.**

Students are free to apply for any module from the elective module lists. You should note that some modules require certain pre-requisite qualifications. If you need further details about a particular module you should contact the module Convenor or module owning school.

QUALIFICATION AS A LAWYER IN OTHER JURISDICTIONS

English and French Law is a four-year course offered in cooperation with Aix-Marseille Université (AMU) and the Universities of Bordeaux, Grenoble and Paris 1 (Panthéon-Sorbonne). Students from the University of Kent studying this degree will spend the first two years and the final year (Stages 1, 2 and 3) of the course at Kent, and the third year (Stage A) at a French University.

You must study 120 Credits in Stages 2 and 3. At least 90 Credits must be taken at Level 6 during Stage 3 to be eligible for an Honours degree. Please ensure that you choose an even weighting of Credits in each term: 60 Credits in Autumn / 60 Credits in Spring. Level 4 elective modules cannot be taken at Stage 2 or 3.

- 1. An average of 60% (or a Merit on preponderance) in Stage 1 is a pre-requisite to entry to the year abroad. Students who are not eligible for the year abroad will be transferred to another course, usually the LLB Law. The Director of the course will consider applications for entry to the year abroad from students who do not achieve the required standard if:
 - a) There is documented evidence of exceptional circumstances that have interfered with the student's academic performance in Stage 1, and
 - b) the Director of the course is satisfied that, where appropriate to the circumstances, appropriate support is available whilst abroad to mitigate the effect of those circumstances, or
 - c) In order to contribute to widening participation in Higher Education, the student meets one of more of the contextual indicators required for entry.
- 2. A pass in LAWS5390 Droit Français is a pre-requisite for entry to Stage A of the degree.
- 3. Students should note that some of the above-named modules may not be available in any given year, and that there may be timetable clashes.
- 4. Students who enrol in a Certificate/Diploma course should note that they may have a limited choice of options.
- 5. Students who reach the required standard during the year abroad may be awarded a Certificate/Diploma in French Law by the host institution (Aix-Marseille Université, Bordeaux and Grenoble only).

STAGE A - 120 Credits

Stage A will be spent in the Faculty of Law at one of the institutions listed below. In principle, students will register for a Certificate/Diploma in French Law (this decision is subject to the authorisation of the DoS at Kent and the French University).

A small number of places are available at the Sorbonne and in Bordeaux. Selection for these two destinations will be made on the basis of academic performance. It is strongly recommended that students achieve an *overall mark of at least 65%* in Stage 1.

Aix-Marseille Université

Students may register for the standard Erasmus course or the Diploma course in French Law.

Bordeaux

Students may register for the Certificate course in French Law.

Grenoble

Students may register for **either** the Diploma in French Law course **or** the Diploma in Administration and International Politics course

Paris I (Panthéon-Sorbonne)

Students may register for the standard Erasmus course only.

There are usually a limited number of places available to study at one of the designated host continental European partner-universities during the year abroad. Places are allocated normally on the following basis: (1) students submit their preferred short list of host partner universities to the Erasmus Placements Team, International Development Office, The Registry, University of Kent during the early part of the Autumn term of Stage 2; (2) places for each host partner university are then normally allocated by the Director of ELS according to individual student preference in so far as possible. However, where demand for a partner university exceeds the number of places available, the allocation will in principle be determined usually on the basis of academic performance of individual students during Stage 1 of the degree course. Exceptionally though, a place may be allocated to a student by the Director of ELS if there are particularly strong academic-related or personal reasons for this to be done (e.g. a student wishes to study the language of the country of a particular host partner university during Stage 1 and/or 2).

The year abroad is assessed on a pass/fail basis. Students who fail the year abroad will ultimately revert to the LLB Law. Students should refer to the Online Module Catalogue (entry for LAWS7000) for an explanation of 'pass' and 'fail' in this context.

- b) The Director of the course is satisfied that, where appropriate to the circumstances, appropriate support is available whilst abroad to mitigate the effect of those circumstances, or
- c) in order to contribute to widening participation in Higher Education, the student meets one or more of the contextual indicators required for entry.
