#### **Overall Credit Requirements**

# **CLASSICAL & ARCHAEOLOGICAL STUDIES**

#### Note: It is ultimately your responsibility to ensure that you are registered for the correct modules for your programme.

Classical & Archaeological Studies examines culture and society in both Greece and Rome as well as in neighbouring regions, with an emphasis upon the first millennia BC and AD. The programme is divided into three 'pathways' (*Literature, History* and *Archaeology*). Students may specialise in one pathway, or combine modules from different areas.

Students must study **120 credits** at both Stage 2 and Stage 3 giving a total of 240 credits over the two stages. At least 90 credits must be at Level H to be eligible for an Honours degree. Students should normally take Level I modules at Stage 2 and Level H modules at Stage 3. Any deviation from this must be agreed with the Director of Undergraduate Studies Dr Steve Willis.

Students are expected to choose 60 credits in the Autumn and 60 credits in the Spring term.

## **COMPARATIVE LITERATURE**

#### Note: It is ultimately your responsibility to ensure that you are registered for the correct modules for your programme.

Comparative Literature offers modules in the study of a wide range of literature from antiquity to the modern age. Students must study 120 credits at both Stage 2 and Stage 3 giving a total of 240 credits over the two stages. At least 90 of these 240 credits must be at Level H to be eligible for an Honours degree.

Texts which are not originally in English will be studied in translation and no knowledge of a foreign language is required. Students are expected to register for 60 credits in each term.

#### **Single Honours**

Single Honours students must choose between 180 and 240 credits of Comparative Literature over Stages 2 and 3. This must include the compulsory modules CP510 at Stage 2 and CP513 at Stage 3. These modules cannot be compensated, condoned or trailed for Single Honours Students.

#### **Joint Combinations**

Joint Honours students must choose between 90 and 150 credits of Comparative Literature over Stages 2 and 3. You must also take into consideration the module requirements for your other subject when making your module choices.

The Humanities Faculty offers European Studies as a 4-year programme, available either with a single language (French, German, Hispanic Studies or Italian), two Languages (Combined), or as a Joint degree with a Humanities subject.

This four year programme consists of first year (Stage 1), second year (Stage 2), year abroad (Stage A) and final year (Stage 3). Students must study **120 Credits** at both Stage 2 and Stage 3. At least 90 Credits must be at Level H to be eligible for an Honours degree. Students should normally take Level I modules at Stage 2. Students are expected to study 60 Credits in each term.

## **Module Requirements**

Across Stages 2 and 3 students registered on all four-year European Studies programmes, except **Combined Languages**, must take a minimum of **60 Credits** of European Studies AND **60 Credits** of Language AND **60 Credits** of Specialist or Joint Honours modules.

Across Stages 2 and 3 students registered on the European Studies (Combined Languages) degree are required to take a minimum of **60 Credits** of European Studies core modules AND at least **60 Credits** in each the Languages studied.

#### The Year Abroad or Half-Year Abroad (Stage A)

Students studying a German degree are required to spend the year of study between Stages 2 and 3 in a German-speaking country unless specifically exempted by Faculty Board. The Year Abroad will total 120 credits. These students may choose one of three options:

- **Option 1:** Follow a full-time course of study at a partner university in the Federal Republic of Germany or Austria. Students will gain their marks from their oral performance and from the modules they study.
- **Option 2:** Teach as a language assistant (up to 12 hours per week) in schools in the Federal Republic of Germany or Austria.
- **Option 3:** Engage in full-time employment in an approved occupation anywhere in German-speaking Europe.

At the time of going to print, students who select **Option 2 or 3** will gain their marks from their oral performance in the language and from written work submitted by 1 September for marking by Kent German staff.

# ITALIAN

#### Note: It is ultimately your responsibility to ensure that you are registered for the correct modules for your programme.

This four year Single and Joint Honours degree programme consists of first year (Stage 1), second year (Stage 2), year abroad (Stage A) and final year (Stage 3). Students must study **120 credits** at both Stage 2 and Stage 3 giving a total of 240 credits over the two stages. Students should normally take Level I modules at Stage 2. At least 90 credits must be at Level H to be eligible for an Honours degree. Students are expected to study 60 credits in the Autumn term, and 60 credits in the Spring term.

Students taking Italian with a non-language discipline spend a year in Italy whilst those taking Italian with a language discipline may split the Year Abroad between the countries of both languages.

# **PHILOSOPHY**

#### Note: It is ultimately your responsibility to ensure that you are registered for the correct modules for your programme.

As a student of Philosophy you do not so much learn about Philosophy as learn to do it yourself. Although this learning often means studying major philosophies and philosophers (for example Plato, Descartes, Wittgenstein), we expect you to contribute your own ideas to an ongoing dialogue. The teaching aims to be stimulating, with informative lectures and the opportunity for lively debates in seminars.

Philosophy may be taken as a Single or Joint Honours degree programme. Students must study **120 credits** at both Stages 2 & 3 giving a total of 240 credits over the two stages. At least 90 credits must be at Level H to be eligible for an Honours degree. Students should normally take Level I modules at Stage 2 and may only take Level H at Stage 2 where permission has been given by the Director of Undergraduate Studies. Students are expected to study 60 credits in the autumn and the spring term.

# PHILOSOPHY AND LAW

For this Joint Honours Degree Students must study **120 credits** at both Stages 2 and 3 giving a total of 240 credits over the two stages. At least 90 credits must be at Level H to be eligible for an Honours degree. Students should normally take Level I modules at Stage 2.

Over Stages 2 & 3, students are required to take **90 credits** from Philosophy PLUS **90 credits** from Law. The remaining **60 credits** may be taken from **either** Philosophy and/or Law.

Students should normally take Level I modules at Stage 2 and may only take Level H at Stage 2 where permission has been given by the Director of Undergraduate Studies, Professor Jeremy Carrette. Students are expected to take 60 credits in the Autumn term and 60 credits in the Spring term.
